Hydrant Flushing Season

Hydrants will be flushed late night October 9, 10 & 11th

Water may be rusty and pressure decreased at night. Allow water to run for a moment in morning before use.

Burning Leaves is Against the Law

Please place leaves at edge of property not in the road and on sidewalks. Leaves can be taken to Village Dump.

Fall Lawn Cleaning Advice

Brush Pickup: is the first full week of every month. Small twigs, lawn and garden waste must be bagged or bundled. 50lbs. maximum weight. Place on edge of property not in streets. Limit 10 units per home per pickup.

Mowing Grass: clippings into the streets and sidewalks is against the law and can result in a fine. With fall rains grass clippings end up in the street drains, clogging them up, and can result in flooding of your and neighboring homes.

Brush Dump: Village residents can dump their own brush, lawn waste, etc. at the end of Grove Street at the Village's Brush Dump.
