8/3 - Charges were filed reference an assault in the PS Food Mart parking lot that stemmed from a reckless driving issue.



8/3 - The big storm that hit in the afternoon dumped trees and power lines everywhere. At least 18 individual calls came in reference this, but I didn't list them above.



8/10 - A child's bike was taken from a home on S. Main St, but it was later returned unharmed.



8/13 - There was a physical domestic situation on Railroad St. in the village.



8/15 - A domestic incident between teenage siblings came in on Mill St.



8/21 - A domestic situation on Hanover St. transitioned into a mental health emergency and the subject involved was transported to the hospital for help.



8/23 - In an act of general alcohol-fueled stupidity, a man began shedding his clothes on Albion Rd - down to his skivvies. He was provided assistance.



8/25 - A husband and wife combo driving through the area - but not from Concord - experienced a crisis when the wife jumped from the vehicle and began threatening to kill herself. She was ultimately transported by ambulance to the hospital for treatment.



8/29 - A woman with multiple felony warrants was walking through the park without a care in the world. She was taken into custody peacefully and arrested for her warrants.



8/30 - I handled a car crash at the main 4-way in the village between a minivan and an empty hog hauler semi.
