OFF DUTY POLICE RELATED SITUATIONS HANDLED

4 in the village and 7 in the township – 11 TOTAL

((No incident numbers are drawn for these)))



4/5/2022: A padlock was snapped off a storage building on M-60 near the hair salon (but nothing was taken), and several exterior items (umbrella poles) were taken from the vacant BBQ restaurant – although it might have been the former tenants. Things that make you go hmmmmmm...



4/6/2022: A pair of female citizens got into a brief tussle at the PS Food Mart before common sense prevailed. A report was completed.



4/7/2022: I assisted Spring Arbor Police Chief Noppe at the McDonald's on M-60. A man was acting 'strangely' and also found to be in possession of an unregistered handgun. (Not a good combination). He was ultimately transported to the hospital for medical attention and charges will be sought for the gun.



4/8/2022: While on foot patrol along the railroad tracks near Bath Mills Rd, I came across several subjects and vehicles that were in the process of stealing black elm trees. Several units responded to assist as well as the DNR, who has multiple active cases going against these subjects. Several vehicles and a trailer were towed away. The charges are ongoing.



4/9/2022: I assisted CPS on a case in the village involving 'inappropriate touching' of a young girl.



4/9/2022: I responded to a domestic situation on Behling Rd. between an adult mother and son combination.



4/11/2022: I responded – and Animal Control assisted – in a dog bite situation on S. Concord St. in the village. A resident was walking his small dog when a large dog from a nearby house snapped his chain and attacked. The walking dog's owner was injured when trying to break up the attack and neighbors also stepped in. Both the walker and his dog were ultimately okay and the attacking dog was ultimately euthanized.



4/19/2022: A series of small grass fires popped up on Albion Rd. north of Schultz Rd. A citizen and I bravely fought the blazes before any real damage could occur. I actually commandeered a rake from a nearby farmhouse to use in the battle, although the homeowner made sure to get that rake back. Concord Fire arrived to finish up, but I had it all under control.



4/26/2022: A subject spun some donuts in the community center parking lot, but his license plate was obtained. Contact was made with him and his family in the Jerome area.



4/28/2022: I assisted CPS in an interview on Albion Rd. in the village. The subject was one of the most confrontational and combative people I've encountered in twenty years in law enforcement. The interview, while not going 'smoothly,' was completed without incident.



Cases of Countywide Stupidity

- A woman called 911 to report that she'd corralled a stray dog on her porch that she ultimately took to the animal shelter. While the dog was on her porch, it scratched her door.... She called 911 to file a 'property damage' report, apparently against the stray dog.
- A woman called 911 to report her 6 y/o son was being 'unruly' and not waking up for school... She requested police assistance.
