

ORDINANCE # 123

AN ORDINANCE TO REQUIRE LICENSING OF GARBAGE COLLECTION VEHICLES.

THE VILLAGE OF CONCORD ORDAINS:

Section 1. That any individual, firm, co-partnership, or corporation collecting garbage and transporting same over the streets or alleys of the Village of Concord, shall obtain a license to do so, and upon issuance of such license shall agree and provide that they shall pay all fees necessary for the disposal of such garbage. Collecting vehicles for garbage shall have completely enclosed watertight bodies and be so designed that the wheel and axle loads when fully loaded shall not exceed the schedule of weights allowed by the laws of the State of Michigan and The Village of Concord. All applicants shall submit with their application an accurate description of the vehicles used for collection and transportation and a schedule of rates to be charged to citizens for the year that license covers. The fee for such license shall be Fifteen (\$15.00) dollars for all or any part of a year.

Application for a license shall be made to the Village Clerk and approved by the Council, if the Council so desires and applied for January 1st of each year. The Council shall have the right to revoke any license at any time if the circumstances warrant so doing.

Section 2. Penalties. Any person, agent, employees or sub-contractor, except a person licensed by the Village of Concord to transport or collect garbage, who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof punished by a fine not to exceed One Hundred (\$100.00) dollars, or by imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court. Every day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense. The imposition of any sentence shall not exempt the defendant from the compliance with the requirements of this Ordinance.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be published in full in the Concord News, a newspaper of general circulation in the Village of Concord qualified under State law to publish legal notices within two weeks of its adoption.
