

## BY-LAW No. XIII.

An Ordinance Relative To Meetings Of Common Council.

The Village of Concord, Mich., ordains as follows:

Section 1. The regular meetings of the Common Council shall be upon the first Wednesday evening of each month, and all meetings shall be held in the Council Rooms in said Village; but said Common Council may adjourn to any other place.

Section 2. Special meetings of said Common Council shall be called at any time at the request of any two Trustees of said Village, or upon the petition, in writing of twenty electors of said Village asking for such special meeting; such request or petition shall be presented to the Clerk of said Village, who shall call a meeting of said Common Council to be held not less than twenty-four hours from notice of the same, which notice shall be in writing and served personally upon all members of the Common Council who may be within the limits of said Village, and shall be served by the Marshal or any Policeman of said Village, and a return thereof shall be made to the President of said Village.

Section 3. No business shall be transacted at any special meeting of said Common Council except such business as was stated in the notice thereof to be the object of such meeting.

Section 4. A record shall be made of all by-laws or ordinances, resolutions, or other proceedings of the Common Council, in a book furnished for that purpose, and such record shall be open for inspection or examination by any person.

Section 5. No Notice of the regular meetings of the Common Council shall be given, but the members thereof, and the Marshal, shall attend without notice.

Section 6. In case the presence of any officer of said Village shall be deemed necessary, at any meeting of the Common Council, such officer shall attend at the request of the President or the Chairman of any committee of the said Common Council.

Section 7. No person shall willfully interrupt or disturb any meeting of said Common Council.

Section 8. No person, either member of the Common Council or other person, shall refuse or neglect to obey any lawful order of the presiding officer while presiding over any meeting of said Common Council made for the purpose of preserving order in said Council.

Section 9. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars, and not exceeding twenty dollars, and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the county jail not more than ten days, and in case fine and costs shall be imposed, the court before whom such conviction shall be had, may make a further order and judgment, that in default of payment of such fine and costs within a time to fixed by such court, the person so convicted shall be imprisoned in the county jail until such fine and costs be paid for a term not exceeding twenty days.
