

BY-LAW No. XIV.

An Ordinance Relative To Cleaning Streets.

The Village of Concord, Mich., ordains as follows:

Section 1. It shall also be the duty of all owners and occupants and agents having charge of all lots and premises adjoining or lying along any street or public highway in the Village to keep and maintain that portion of the street or highway adjoining or being alongside of such premises, to the center of such street or highway, free and clear of all rubbish, stones, sticks, brush or other obstructions; and also to keep and maintain the same free and clear of all noxious weeds, and to prevent the same from ripening or maturing seed; and also to keep all butters, ditches, furrows or other excavations along said street, whereby the same or the adjoining premises are wholly or in part drained, or by means of which water is carried along or away from such street or premises, free and clear of all rubbish, sand, gravel, earth or other obstructions or impediment to the passage or escape of such water, and every person who shall neglect or refuse, after due notice, as provided in section two of this By-Law, for twenty-four hours to comply with the requirements of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine of not more than twenty dollars, together with the costs of prosecution, in the discretion of the court.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the President, Clerk, and Marshal, or either of them, to notify each and every person, owner, occupant or agent, orally or by written or printed notice, offending against the provisions of the foregoing section, and if the premises be vacant and there be no resident agent in charge thereof, and the owner thereof be unknown or a non-resident, then by written or printed notice posted in a conspicuous place upon such premises, and if such owner, occupant or agent neglect to comply with such requirements for twenty-four hours after receiving such personal notice, or for one week after the posting of said notice, in the case of unknown or non-resident agent or owner, then, upon filing with the Clerk an affidavit showing such notice, it shall be the duty of the Marshal to perform the duty required of such owner, occupant or agent, and to report the expense of such notification and of the performance of such duty to the Common Council and the same shall be assessed against such premises, and be a lien thereon and be collected as provided for collection of other taxes.

Section 3. Every person offending against the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar, and not exceeding five dollars, together with costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the county jail not more than five days.

BY-LAW No. XV.

An Ordinance Relative to Fire Limits.

The Village of Concord, Mich., ordains:

Section 1. That that portion of the Village of Concord, Jackson County, Michigan, within the following described limits is hereby denominated and established as the fire limits in said Village, to-wit: Commencing at the middle of the Hanover street fifteen (15) rods east of the intersection of Main and Hanover streets, in said Village, thence south fifteen (15) rods, thence west thirty (30) rods, thence north thirty-five (35) rods, thence east thirty (30) rods, thence south twenty (20) rods to the place of beginning.

Section 2. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to
