BY-LAW No. XXI.

An Ordinance To Prevent Drunkenness And Punish Drunkards.

The Village of Concord ordains as follows:

Section 1. That any person who shall be drunk or intoxicated in any hotel, tavern, store, saloon, office, or any place of public business, or in assemblage of people collected together in any place for any purpose, or in any street, alley, lane, highway, railway car, or in any other public place within the limits of said Village of Concord; shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars \$20.00 besides costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding sixty days; and if only a fine with the costs be imposed, the court before whom such conviction shall be had may make a further sentence: That in default of the payment of such fine and costs within a time to be fixed by the court, the person so convicted shall be imprisoned in the county jail until such fine and costs are paid, for a term not exceeding sixty days.

Section 2. And it shall be the duty of the Marshal of the Village of Concord to forthwith apprehend and take into his custody every drunk person or intoxicated person in any hotel, tavern, store, saloon, office, or other place of public business, or in any assemblage of people collected together in any place for any purpose, or in any street, alley, lane, highway, railway car, or in any other public place in said village; and to keep such person in his custody until he or she shall become sober, and then to take such person before one of the justices of the peace having jurisdiction, and to make complaint against such person under the provisions of this ordinance; and for refusal or wilful neglect on the part of such marshal to apprehend such person or to make complaint pursuant hereto, he shall for such refusal or wilful neglect be liable upon conviction to be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars besides costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding sixty days.

Section 3. All prosecutions for any violations of this Ordinance shall be commenced within thirty days after such violation.

Section 4. The Village of Concord further ordains that By-law number three (3) entitled an ordinance to prevent drunkenness, and punish drunkards, adopted by the Common Council of said Village of Concord, May 18th, 1893 is hereby repealed.
