BY-LAW No. 22

An Ordinance Relative To Dogs Running at Large.

The Village of Concord ordains as follows:

Section 1. It shall not be lawful for the owner or keeper of any dog or dogs to suffer the same to run at large in the streets, lanes or alleys and other public places within the corporate limits of said village of Concord during the months of July and August in each year unless the same shall be properly and sufficiently muzzled and it shall be the duty of the marshal of the village of Concord to kill or authorize the killing of each and every dog that may be found running at large in said village without being properly muzzled as aforesaid, and the owner of every such dog or dogs also the person who, upon satisfactory proof, shall be shown to be the reported owner or harbor of such dogs shall be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar and not exceeding five dollars with costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the village prison or county jail not more than 10 days for each and every violation of this By-Law. The Marshal shall receive as a compensation for the destruction of dogs in accordance with this By-Law the sum of fifty cents per head to be paid from the general funds of the village treasury.

Section 2. Whenever it is deemed necessary by the Common Council of the village of Concord to prevent the running at large of dogs, otherwise than provided for in section one of this By-Law, or to require them to be muzzled at other times than specified in section one of this By-Law or to authorize their destruction, it shall be lawful for said Common Council by resolution to order any dog or dogs within the corporate limits of the village of Concord to be muzzled or destroyed, after posting notices of the same in three public places in said village or inserting one notice of the passage of such resolution in the village paper.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the marshal and police officers of said village to make complaint of all violations of this By-Law.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after its passage.

BY-LAW No. 23.

An Ordinance To Be Known As By Law No. 23, To License And Regulate Hawking And Peddling.

The Village of Concord ordains as follows:

Section 1. That no person having any goods, wares, or merchandise in their possession shall hawk or peddle the same, or offer the same for sale in any street, alley, lane, public place, space, public grounds or public buildings within the corporate limits of the Village of Concord, or carry any such goods, wares or merchandise about said village of Concord for sale from place to place or from house to house, or to take orders for the purchase of goods, wares or merchandise, by sample, list or catalogue, without first having procured a license therefore, as hereinafter provided; Provided, however, that it shall be lawful for any person to sell any fruits, vegetables, grains or any other farm or garden productions, raised by himself, on lands or premises owned or occupied by him in such location as may be fixed for that purpose by the marshal of said village of Concord, or by carrying the same from place to place or from house to house in said village.
