

Section 2. The president and the village clerk are hereby authorized to license any person to engage in or follow the business of hawking and peddling in said village of Concord, provided, however, that no license shall be granted until the person applying therefore shall have paid to the treasurer of said village of Concord for the same according to the following rates:

Licenses may be granted under this ordinance for periods of one day, one week, or one month and for none other.

Section 3. Any person applying for such license shall first pay to the clerk or president of said village the license above specified, and then the clerk or president shall deliver to said person a license according to the specifications when the said person shall have liberty to do business according to the terms of said license.

Section 4. The provision of this ordinance shall not be construed to apply to persons who solicit orders or subscriptions for books, maps, or periodicals for future delivery; nor to persons who subsequently deliver such books, maps, or periodicals in pursuance of such orders, or subscription, nor to regular commercial travelers employed by wholesale houses, and selling staple articles or merchandise to merchants of said village of Concord to be retailed by them nor to persons selling milk, nor to the delivery of goods sold by the business houses in said Village. No license granted under the provisions of this ordinance shall be assignable, nor protect any person but the one to whom it was granted.

Section 5. Every person claiming to have a license issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall exhibit the same to any officer or citizen of said Village of Concord, upon demand, and a refusal to exhibit the same when so demanded, shall be deemed to be conclusive proof to such officer that no license has been issued to such person.

Section 6. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars and not exceeding fifty dollars, and costs of prosecution; and the court before whom such conviction shall be had, may make a further sentence, that in default of the payment of such fine and costs within a time to be fixed by such court, the person so convicted shall be imprisoned in the county jail or village prison until such fine and costs be paid, not exceeding the term of ninety days.

Section 7. And it shall be the duty of the marshal of the village of Concord to forthwith apprehend and take into his custody every person found violating any of the provisions of this ordinance and take such person before one of the justices of the peace having jurisdiction and make complaint against such person under the provision of this ordinance.

Section 8. The Common Council shall at all times have, and does hereby reserve the power by resolution to revoke and cancel any license granted pursuant to this ordinance, which right of revocation and cancellation shall be reserved in every such license granted hereunder.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after its passage.

BY-LAW No. 24.

An Ordinance Relative To Licensing Public Shows and Exhibitions.

The Village of Concord ordains as follows:

Section 1. That no person or persons or corporation shall exhibit in said village of Concord any circus, menagerie or side show, nor exhibit publicly in any public hall, room, tent or other place any show, or to perform publicly any plays, games, theatrical or other performance or concerts whatever, or to exhibit any natural or other curiosity for which pay is demanded or received without first having obtained a license from the village clerk of the said village of Concord and for every license granted for any business, object or purpose herein specified there shall be paid by the person, persons or corporation receiving the same as follows:

Upon a license for a circus or menagerie or a circus and menagerie combined the sum of three (\$3.00) dollars for each day upon which an exhibition shall occur, and for each side show two dollars (\$2.00) for each day's exhibition and upon a license to exhibit public any show, or to perform publicly any plays, games, theatrical, or other performances or concerts whatever or to exhibit any natural or other curiosity in any public hall, room, tent or other place within the corporated limits of said village of Concord the sum of one dollar for each day upon which an exhibition shall occur.

Provided this ordinance shall not apply to any exhibition or concert by the pupils of any school or music teachers residing in this village, nor any concert or entertainment given for any benevolent object, and every proprietor, agent, manager, person in charge, employee assistant or performer in any circus, menagerie, side show, or other public show, exhibition, games, theatrical, concerts or other performances mentioned herein for which license shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance.

Section 2. Any person who shall be guilty of a violation of this ordinance shall on conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs of prosecution and the court before whom such convictions shall be had may make a further sentence or order that in default of the payment of such fine and costs within a time fixed by said court that the person or persons so convicted shall be imprisoned in the county jail until such fine and costs be paid not exceeding sixty days.

Section 3. By Law No. 12 entitled an ordinance relative to licensing public shows and exhibitions adopted by the common council of said village of Concord, October fifth, (5) 1893. is hereby repealed. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after this passage.
