

BY-LAW No. 25.

An Ordinance Relative to the Clerk, Treasurer, and Marshal, filing their official bond before entering upon the duties of their office.

The Village of Concord ordains as follows:

Section 1. That every person elected or appointed to the office of clerk or marshal of the village of Concord before he enters upon the duties of his office, and within the time prescribed by law for filing his official oath shall execute with sufficient sureties a bond in the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00), to be approved by the council of said village. The conditions of this obligation, shall be such that the said clerk and marshall shall well and faithfully in all things discharge the duties of their said office according to law, and in accordance with all ordinances, rules or regulations adopted by the common council of said village of Concord and shall faithfully and truly account for and pay over all moneys which shall come into their hands as such clerk or marshal.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of such clerk and marshal to file within the time above mentioned in section one of this By-Law said bonds with the clerk of said village of Concord, who shall record the same in a book to be provided for that purpose provided that the bond of the village clerk of said village shall be deposited with the treasurer of said village of Concord.

Section 3. Each village treasurer, within the time limited for filing his oath of office and before he shall enter upon the duties of his office shall give a bond to the village of Concord in such sum and with such sureties as the common council shall from time to time require and approve conditioned for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office, and that he will faithfully and truly account for and pay over according to law all moneys which shall come into his hands as such treasurer, and the president of said village shall endorse his approval thereon. It shall be the duty of such treasurer to file within the time above mentioned said bond with the village clerk and said village of Concord, who shall record the same in a book to be provided for that purpose.

Section 4. This By-Law shall upon publication as required by the laws of the State of Michigan take immediate effect.
