

Section 6. The Common Council shall at all times have, and does hereby receive the power by resolution to revoke and cancel any license granted pursuant to this ordinance, which right of revocation and cancellation shall be reserved in every such license granted hereunder.

Section 7. It is hereby provided that nothing in this ordinance shall prevent the sale without a license of any second hand furniture, or second hand household goods, or live stock, or second hand farming implements.

By-Laws No. III.

An Ordinance to prevent Drunkenness and Punish Drunkards

The Village of Concord ordains as follows:

Section 1. That every person who shall get or become drunk or intoxicated within the limits of said Village, or who being drunk or intoxicated shall when drunk or intoxicated come within the limits of said Village, shall upon conviction thereof be punished for the first offense by a fine not to exceed ten days; and for every subsequent offense, when so charged in the complaint and warrant therefor, by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars or by imprisonment in such jail not to exceed sixty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2. It is hereby made the duty of the Marshal of the Village of Concord to forthwith apprehend and take into his custody every person found drunk or intoxicated in any hotel, tavern, store, saloon, office or other place of public business, or upon any street, highway or alley, or at any public meeting or gathering of the people, and to keep such person in his custody until he or she shall become sober, and then to take such person before one of the Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction, and to make complaint against such person under the provisions of this ordinance; and for refusal or willful neglect on the part of such Marshal to apprehend such person, or to make complaint pursuant hereto, he shall for such refusal or neglect be liable upon conviction to be punished by fine not exceeding fifty dollars.

By-Laws No. IV.

An Ordinance to Punish Certain Willful And Malicious Injury to Property.

The Village of Concord ordains:

Section 1. That if any person or persons shall willfully and maliciously destroy, cut or injure in any way any shade or ornamental tree within the limits of said Village, or shall willfully and maliciously enter upon the premises of any person within the limits of the Village of Concord with the willful and malicious intent to do injury to any person or property, or shall willfully and maliciously cut, break, uproot, remove or destroy any fruit or vegetable, plant, flower or shrub, of any person or persons within the Village of Concord, or shall willfully and maliciously cut, break, mar, injure or deface any building, sidewalk, crosswalk, curbing, sign, sign post, bridge, culvert, gutter, pavement, or any fence or hedge, within the corporate limits of said Village, such person or persons shall upon conviction thereof, be punished by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, besides cost of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding ninety days, or both by such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.
