

## ORDINANCE # 32

*Revised*  
The Ordinance as amended is as follows:

Relative to the regulating and licensing of billiard tables and ball alleys kept and maintained within the limits of the Village of Concord, Jackson County, Michigan.

Section 1. The Village of Concord ordains that each and every room and place where any billiard table or ball alley shall be kept or maintained, shall be closed and no games be allowed to be played in said room or place from ten o'clock in the evening of each and every secular day, until six o'clock in the morning of the next following secular day, and said room or place shall remain so closed from ten o'clock in the evening of each and every Saturday until six o'clock in the morning of the following Monday; and no curtains, partitions, screens, signs or other thing that obstruct the full view of the entire room from the street shall be allowed in or back of the windows. No minors under the full age of eighteen years, shall at any time, be permitted to play any games on any of said billiard tables or ball alleys, or any games of any kind in the room or place where the same are kept, and all said minors shall at all times be kept out of said room or place where billiard tables or ball alleys shall be maintained, and the person or persons keeping or maintaining said room or place where billiard tables or ball alleys shall be maintained, shall not, either directly or indirectly, at any time, allow malt, brewed, fermented, vinous, spirituous or intoxicating liquors to be brought in to said room or place for the purpose of being used as a beverage, and all intoxicated and disorderly persons shall at all times be kept out of said room or place, provided that the words "Billiard Table" shall mean all pool tables and any and all like tables kept for the purpose of playing games thereon; and provided further, that this ordinance shall not apply to saloons that have paid their regular tax for selling spirituous and intoxicating liquors and are keeping billiard tables or ball alleys and running the same in connection with said saloon.

Section 2. Every person keeping or maintaining any ball alley under the provision of section one of this ordinance shall pay into the treasury of the Village of Concord, a license of ten dollars per year for each and every ball alley so kept and maintained; the license year shall begin on the first day of May of each year, and no license shall continue longer than to the first day of May after same shall be granted.

Section 3. Any persons violating any of the provisions of section one and two of this ordinance, may be complained of by any person before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction thereof, and upon conviction, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution or by imprisonment in the County Jail of Jackson County, for a period not to exceed ninety days, or both, such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Adopted by the Common Council and approved by the President, this 4th day of June 1909.
