An ordinance to provide for the return of all unpaid taxes on real property to the County Treasurer in the same manner and like effect, as returns by Township Treasurers.

The Village of Concord ordains:

Section 1. That when any tax assessed against real estate by any Village assessor or by any board of Village assessors for village taxes, or special assessments, shall after the levying of such tax, and after said tax has been due and unpaid for a period of sixty days after said levy, or within such other time as the warrant for such collection of same may be extended by the Village Council, it shall be the duty of the Village Treasurer or collecting officer, to make a statement of the same with a full and perfect description of such property, assessed upon said roll, with the several taxes assessed upon each parcel thereof, and the name of the party assessed to which statement shall be verified by the affidavit of such Treasurer, or collector, and that such taxes remain unpaid, and that he has not upon diligent inquiry been able to discover any goods or chattels liable to pay such sums whereupon he could levy the same.

Section 2. Such taxes remaining unpaid shall be returned by the said Village Treasurer, or Collector to the County Treasurer of the County for collection, and with like effect as returns by township treasurers. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage.

Passed by unanimous vote of the Common Council this 1st day of July, A.D. 1910. Approved.
