

ORDINANCE # 38

An ordinance prohibiting saloons or any other places for manufacture, sale, giving away or furnishing any vinous, malt, brewed, fermented, spirituous, intoxicating liquors in the Village of Concord, Michigan.

The Village of Concord ordains as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons directly or indirectly, himself or by his clerk, agent or employee, to manufacture, sell, keep for sale, give away or furnish any vinous, malt, brewed, fermented, spirituous or intoxicating, liquors, or any mixed liquors or beverage, any part of which is intoxicating, or keep a saloon or any other place where any such liquors are manufactured, sold, stored for sale, given away or furnished within the corporate limits of the Village of Concord on and after this ordinance takes effect.

Provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not apply to druggists or registered pharmacists, selling any such liquors under and in compliance with the restrictions and requirements imposed upon by the general laws of this state.

Section 2. Any person, who himself or by his clerk, agent or employee, shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, and the costs of his prosecution and to imprisonment in the county jail not less than twenty days nor more than ninety days in the discretion of the court.

Section 3. Any ordinance or part of any ordinance conflicting with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after its passage.
