ORDINANCE # 48 (Oct. 10, 1949)

The Concord Village Traffic Ordinance

The Village of Concord ordains:

Section 1. This ordinance is declared to be necessary to promote the general welfare, to provide for the safety, to protect the lives of the people of Concord and it is declared to be unlawful for any person to violate this ordinance.

Section 2. A list of such ordinance violations, as do not require formal proceedings in court, and their respective penalties therefor, is shown in this section and is subject to inspection at any time during office hours, in the office of the Village Clerk.

Village Traffic Violations and their penalties:

Parking. All violations \$1.00. This includes operator's or chauffeur's license not on person, plates dirty or obscured or missing.

Improper Lights. All violations \$1.00.

Other Equipment Violations:

Broken or defective muffler	\$2.00
No flag or light on projecting load	\$2.00
No mirror on commercial car	\$1.00

Driving Violations:

Against traffic, left of center	\$3.00
In or out of traffic	\$2.00
Over fire hose or in any way obstructing or interfering with fire fighting operations	\$5.00 to \$100.00
Exceeding one-half the legal rage of speed on turns	\$5.00
With four in drivers' seat	\$3.00
On right of traffic	\$2.00
On or over sidewalk	\$2.00
Through funeral procession	\$5.00
Through private property	\$2.00
On left of dividing line of drive	\$3.00
Backing around a corner without an assistant	\$2.00
Baking more than 60 feet	\$2.00
Failure to give right-of-way to firemen or police	\$5.00
Failure to stop at stop street or on leaving alley	\$2.00
Slow cars not keeping to the right	\$4.00
Turn that is prohibited or improper	\$2.00

Miscellaneous Violations:

Excessive noise from muffer, whistle, horn or exhaust including blowing of horn excessively	\$5.00
Failure to move disabled vehicle	\$5.00
Parking "for sale" cars on street or village property	\$2.00

Section 3. In the event of repeated violations by any one individual, the justice of the peace shall have the right to suspend the operator's license for a period not to exceed ninety days, and for failure to pay for violations, the alternative of being confined in the County Jail, not to exceed thirty days.

Section 4. Complaint may be made by the Police Officer or Marshall of the Village of Concord, to any Justice of the Peace residing in Concord Township.

Section 5. Each violator shall be presented by the complaining officer, with a violation ticket; giving the time and date of violation, nature of same, name of officer, car make and number of license; or such card may be placed in a conspicuous spot on the vehicle. The violation card shall direct the violator to report to one of the said Justices of the Peace when he shall have the option of paying the penalty prescribed and costs of having the case tried in the usual way in court.

Section 6. Any person who has received such a violation card may, within the time specified, in such notice, answer to said Justice of the Peace, to the charge set forth, in such notice pleading guilty to the charge and waiving a formal hearing in court and paying the fine and costs prescribed for the violation charged. Such fine and costs shall be deemed in complete satisfaction for the violation and the violator shall be given a receipt which so states.

Section 7. The said Justice of the Peace shall receive all money so paid and all fines in excess of the costs shall be regularly paid over by the said Justice to the Clerk of the Village of Concord. The said Justice of the Peace shall keep a record of all fines and costs, so paid and such record shall be subject to inspection at any time by the president of the Village of Concord or by trustees of the Village when acting in their official capacity.

Section 8. When complaining officer issues a violation card, he shall send a duplicate of same to the Village of Concord. The said clerk shall keep a record of all such violation cards and also of the monies received from the said Justice of the Peace for violation shown on each card.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect October 10, 1949, three days after being published in the Concord News.

Amendment to Ordinance # 48

The Village of Concord Ordains:

Any person who drives any vehicle upon a village street carelessly, heedless, unwillful or wanton disregard of their right or safety, or without do caution and conception, at a speed or any manner so as to endanger or likely to endanger any person or property, shall be guilty of careless driving.

Any person who shall violate this ordinance shall, upon conviction be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days in either the County Jail or Municipal Jail.
