OFF DUTY POLICE RELATED SITUATIONS HANDLED

7 in the village and 5 in the township - 12 TOTAL

6/7/2022: An elderly female went to pick her cat up from the Concord Vet Clinic and fell several times getting out of her vehicle before being assisted inside. Myself and Concord Rescue responded to check on her and it was determined she was highly intoxicated. Ultimately she was turned over to her family.



6/8/2022: I responded to a traffic crash at Erie Rd. and N. Concord Rd. when traffic was redirected through our area because of multiple fatal crashes on I-94.



6/9/2022: I responded to a verbal domestic situation on Hanover St. between mother and son.



6/9/2022: A woman walking the Falling Waters Trail with friends accidentally left her vehicle unlocked. When she returned from her walk, she discovered her purse had been stolen. As I was getting her information for the report, her credit cards were actively being used at Target and JC Penney in Jackson. Ultimately I was able to obtain a photograph of a woman (the suspect) using the cards but, at this point, I have not been able to identify her. Her photograph is available at the Village Office if anyone wants to take a look!



6/10/2022: A subject dumped a basketball hoop, a Rubbermaid shed and other junk at village burn pile. I was able to identify a couple of suspects from Pulaski and contact was made with them. Ultimately, the subjects removed (almost all) of the items and there was *some* credibility to their story.



6/14/2022: I handled a 'destruction of property' report at the Carr Bros. complex on Elm Row Rd. On 6/29/2022 - and after putting up some pretty good security cameras - presumably the same suspect returned, only this time to steal some tools. This time, however, he was identified and will now be criminally charged. He is a local subject from Hutchisson Rd.



6/16/2022: An elderly male subject had been coming into the Concord Post Office and telling a female employee about inappropriate dreams he'd been having about her - obviously making her uncomfortable. I made contact with him and advised him to keep his dream stories to himself and avoid unnecessary communication with her.



6/19/2022: A single vehicle car crash on Behling Rd. resulted in the death of a local resident.



6/22/2022: A catalytic converter was stolen off a parked RV on Hanover St. in the village. This type of theft - converters being cut off motorhomes and RV's - is becoming more and more common.



6/25/2022: A pair of kayaks were reported stolen from a home on Mill St. in the village.



6/27/2022: A black walnut tree was cut down and stolen from behind a home on Grove St. in the village. The suspect was identified within a matter of minutes and charges were filed and approved against him.
