Yard Waste Collection

Yard waste shall be collected during the first FULL week of each month, weather permitting, according to the following policies: All materials for collection shall be placed at the edge of the street no later than 7:00 am of the morning of the collection week. All eligible materials shall be placed in biodegradable paper bags, bundles or labeled containers with a maximum of 50 lbs. per unit. The maximum limit is 10 units, per residence, per pick up. Leaves may be left loose for collection in the fall. Tree limbs and brush must be cut to lengths not exceeding 5 feet and cannot exceed 6 inches in circumference.

Motioned by A. Meeks, seconded by K. George, to accept the minutes from the 3/23/2021 meeting as presented Motion approved by all.

Public Comments:

K. Wyatt asked about what happened when L. Jacobson and Building Inspector M. Levy went through the former Shannon's building. J. Bush stated that the information on their findings was turned over to Village attorney F. Lucas and he is working on it.

The Payment of Bills in the amount of \$104,142.48 was presented. Motioned by A. Meeks, seconded by K. George, to approve the payment of bills in the amount of \$104,142.48. Motion approved by all.

USDA RD Water Main Project Pay Approval in the amount of \$98,233.80 was presented. Motioned by J. Bush, seconded by J. Jackson, to approve the payment of Expense for Water Main Project in the amount of \$98,233.80 . Motion approved by all.

J. Blossom informed the council that a lot of work has been done at the park – the scoreboard that was donated has been put up and the electric will be hooked up soon. He also stated that A. Riddle will be organizing the bands for Concord Classic Weekend this year. J. Blossom informed the council that the aerators have been placed in the sewer lagoon and are wired we are waiting on Consumers to inspect and turn the power on. He also let everyone know that Baseball and Softball games will be starting soon and some teams have already begun practicing.

J. Bush discussed the Civil Infraction for Violation of Zoning Ordinance that was passed at the last meeting. It was recommended by Village Attorney F. Lucas to first approve by the Planning Commission in a Public Hearing. The Public Hearing was held on April 20, 2021. The Planning Commission approved during the Public Hearing, Motioned by J. Bush to approve the Civil Infraction for Violation of Zoning Ordinance on advice of Village Attorney F. Lucas, seconded by J. Jackson. All were in favor. Motion approved.

Council Comments:

J. Bush informed the council that he will again be coaching youth softball on Tuesday nights and may be late or unable to attend a meeting or two. Pro Tem M. Lovitt will run the meetings in his absence.
