OFF DUTY POLICE RELATED SITUATIONS HANDLED

5 in the village and 3 in the township - 8 TOTAL

July 5: Units responded to a home in the township for a domestic disturbance. Ultimately, the State Police arrested a township resident for felonious assault.



July 5: Someone attempted to pry their way into a machine at the car wash. I DO have a suspect for this, but I don't have any proof to get charges approved. The business owner was strongly encouraged to put up security cameras as my suspect would be easily identifiable on video.



July 6: Three juveniles on bikes caused a ruckus at the Dollar General by yelling at employees and knocking over merchandise stands before leaving the area. They were NOT local kids and headed east on the bike trail.



July 7: Neighbors on S. Parma Rd. got into (yet another) heated argument over the placement of a small business sign on shared property.



July 8: A village resident was driving on M-60, east of Spring Arbor, when he inexplicably threw a partially filled plastic bottle out of his window, striking a westbound car as it drove in the opposite direction. Using a partial plate and a vehicle description, I was able to identify the subject and connect with him. He was issued a misdemeanor citation for littering.



July 11: While on patrol, I came across a vehicle parked along King Rd. A woman in that vehicle was emptying papers and trash from her vehicle into the middle of the road and setting it on fire. When I asked her what she was doing, she responded, 'duh, I'm cleaning out my car.' She stated she'd just gotten into an argument with her daughter, who got out of the car and walked off, and she (mom) decided to clean out the trash and then set fire to it. She was issued several misdemeanor citations. (You cannot make this stuff up.)



July 12: A subject driving on Keeler Rd stopped and chucked an empty carton of ice cream at a residence there. Unknown on the flavor.



July 13: A tall semi-truck hit the traffic signal on S. Main St. by the school, causing traffic to be directed around it while it was being repaired.



July 14: I came across 6x young puppies that had been dumped on Schultz Rd. They were transported to the animal shelter and all 6 have been adopted out.



July 18: I assisted multiple units at the fatal car crash on Moscow Rd. @ Sears Rd.



July 19: A unit subbing for me arrested a drunk driver at the PS Food Mart on a beautiful Sunday morning.



July 21: A subject with multiple warrants for the theft of walnut trees was pulled over in the township and arrested.



July 26: I assisted Spring Arbor Township Chief Deering w/ an overdose case on S. Sandstone Rd.



Typically, when someone says they had a police contact and 'got a ticket,' it refers to a traffic citation or other civil infraction. These can generally be handled over the phone or online w/ the court. However, if someone is issued a misdemeanor citation (such as a couple of instances above) those are actual arrests. The only difference is, the person is not taken to the jail for processing.
