May 3 - A group of local kids were kicked out of school for a few days and decided to return wearing ski masks and dressed in all black. This was a shockingly stupid decision and, in today's world, they were very lucky this didn't end much, much worse. They were admonished by school officials and myself and parents were notified.



May 6 - Three cows got loose on N. Concord Rd. and refused to budge for traffic. Eventually, we were able to get them to mooooooove. (Get it?)



May 8 - While working late, I assisted another unit with a suicidal subject in Pulaski, armed with a knife AND a handgun. Fortunately, it ended well and the subject was transported to the hospital for help.



May 9 - I was first-on-scene on just south of Pulaski for a serious crash involving a single man on a moped. While driving southbound, he lost control of the moped, bounced into a ditch and flipped over, landing on his head in the roadway. He was ultimately air-lifted to UM Hospital in Ann Arbor with significant injuries.



May 10 - I handled a landlord/tenant dispute on E. Center St.



May 16 - I assisted the fire department with a cluster of small brush fires on N. Concord Rd.



May 17 - I conducted a personal welfare check on a village resident who was going through a very difficult breakup.



May 18 - I worked alongside the Jackson County Medical Examiner reference a natural death investigation on Parsons Rd.



May 20 - The school was the victim of a fraud situation when someone in the Detroit area duplicated a school check and got a Metro Detroit bank to accept it. That investigation is ongoing.



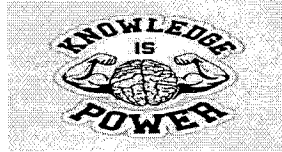
May 21 - I assisted a unit up in Springport on a drunk driving arrest where the driver, a woman, initially ran off into some woods.



May 25 - There were 6x separate calls over a three day span involving a township juvenile (and the school) with ongoing mental health issues. He was transported to the hospital several times for treatment and, at last word, was being admitted to a specialized facility.



May 26 - A village resident on S. Main St. had several valuable lawn decorations stolen from her property.
