OFF DUTY POLICE RELATED SITUATIONS HANDLED

8 in the village and 5 in the township - 13 TOTAL

September 2: I assisted Spring Arbor Police - along with multiple county and state units - on a large-scale domestic debacle on S. Deering Rd. in Spring Arbor involving a child custody exchange (involving multiple families) that went bonkers.



September 4: A subject entered the Subway store on M-60 and ordered 2 subs. When the first foot-long was completed, he snatched it and ran from the store without paying. He didn't ask for cookies or chips, however.



September 7: A woman visited Blossom Farms on M-60 and settled on a pair of glorious mums in full bloom. She then stuffed napkins in the payment box to make it look like she was paying for them. After this, she took the mums to her mom and gave them to her as a surprise present. Sadly, she was captured on video doing this. The mums were returned to the farm and the woman was trespassed from the complex.



September 8: A 17 y/o female from Pulaski, having issues at home, simply left and refused to return. CPS and other agencies are involved in this on-going situation and the young lady frequents Concord.



September 13: Up to 20 mailboxes were stolen from addresses in Sandstone, Parma and Concord. The mailboxes were then lined up at a Shell station in Blackman Township and left. We have not been able to identify the suspect(s) involved, but everyone received their mailbox back.



September 14: I handled a rollover pickup-truck crash on Sears Rd.



September 15: I assisted units in Horton regarding a man looking in sheds and campers for his lost dog. It was determined the man suffers from mental issues and the dog in question died in 2016.



September 16: I received multiple complaints about a 'crotch rocket' motorcycle driving at high rates of speeds through Concord. The driver was identified and warned to slow down.



September 20: Units responded to a serious car crash on M-60 @ Grove St.



September 21: A man on an Amtrak train - rolling through Concord Twp - suffered a medical emergency and the train had to stop on the N. Concord Rd. tracks for rescue crews to assist him. There were, to my knowledge, no snakes on the train.



September 21: I handled a death by suicide call on Behling Rd.



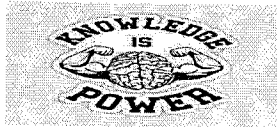
September 23: Myself - and numerous other departments - have received a rash of complaints and 911 calls on a Concord Township resident who suffers from multiple mental health issues. This is an ongoing situation.



September 24: The Concord Car Wash was broken into overnight and the changes machines were emptied.



September 28: DPW Director Blossom was working on the water tower after hours when three subjects began doing donuts in Gottschalk Park. He was able to provide license plate numbers on all three vehicles and the suspects were identified and confessed to the stupidity. The report was sent to the prosecutor's office for MDOP charges.



This remains an on-going issue, so I'll throw it out there again. If someone pulls up behind me, when I'm parked and/or running radar, and exits their vehicle to speak to me, I will drive away. From an officer-safety standpoint, this is a terrible, terrible idea.
