October 4: I assisted units in Hanover on a suicidal subject call.



October 6: Due to proximity, I was first on-scene to a domestic dispute in Pulaski.



October 8: Dispatched to a domestic situation in the village involving mom and her 14 y/o son.



October 9: A portable generator was found by a property-owner along his tree line off of Michigan St - most likely stolen and forgotten there. At this point, we have NOT taken any reports of one being stolen or missing, so it remains a bit of a mystery. It was taken into evidence.



October 11: Multiple calls came in to 911 involving a township residence being extremely upset over... well, everything. He ultimately came into the township office, causing quite a ruckus. The situation was calmed down, but this remains an ongoing issue.



October 11: I assisted staff on-scene at Concord Elementary School with a situation involving combating middle school students.



October 12: A township resident called to report a trespasser on their property, looking inside buildings and carrying around a hatchet. The subject was easily identifiable on video and warned NOT to do this. Property owners: GET SECURITY CAMERAS!



October 17: Between myself and the state police, six deer were injured after being hit by vehicles on M-60 between Mann Rd. and Van Wert Rd. and had to be put down. These were all individual incidents.



October 18: I assisted Animal Control with a loose German shepherd down near Paddock Lake. It was ultimately captured and returned home.



October 21: A subject opened a pack of powdered donuts at the Dollar General store, ate a few of them, and then left, leaving the open package behind. No, it was not me.

UPDATE: The Jackson County Prosecutor's Office APPROVED CHARGES of MDOP (Malicious Destruction of Property) against the three individuals caught doing donuts and tearing up the millings at the ballfields.
