November 6: I handled a peace officer complaint on Mann Rd. involving a recently divorced couple embroiled in a property dispute.



November 7: I assisted units in Parma reference a disturbed man climbing on top of his van (and up into trees) and screaming at passing motorists. He was coaxed down from his elevated position(s) and transported to the hospital for evaluation.



November 9: A school bus, attempting to execute a turn on Swains Lake Dr., backed into a vehicle parked alongside the road.



November 11: I responded to a domestic situation on Hanover St between a recently separated couple. A PPO had been issued by a judge and - in this case - the male half of the equation had to leave. He ultimately fired this parting shot at her: "I don't know why you have to be such a turd." Why, indeed...



November 13: Units responded to another divorce domestic on Mann Rd - a different address from the one listed above.



November 17: I handled two traffic crashes that came in within a few minutes of each other. #1 - in the first, a man suffering a medical emergency crashed into a Concord Mfg. truck. #2 - in the second, a teenager on M-60 crashed into another vehicle that was executing a legal turn. Luckily, no one was injured in these.

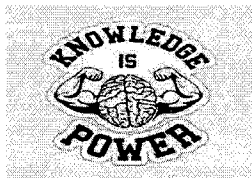


November 21: Neighbors got into a large shouting match on Hanover St that led to assault charges being filed against one of them. The entire episode was captured on video.



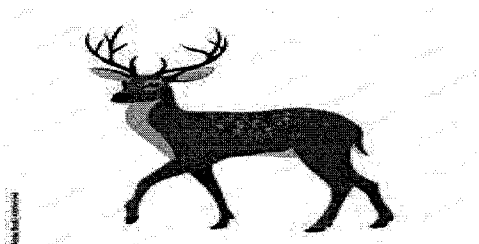
November 23: I assisted multiple units in Parma reference a man threatening people with a gun. Ultimately, it was discovered the gun usage and threats
