CALLS OF NOTE

January 10: I responded to Parsons Rd for a jail scam. The caller claimed to be from a bondsman at the jail, needing money to facilitate the release of a family member of the victim. None of this was actually taking place and it was merely an attempt to coerce the victim into providing bank information.



January 12: A woman called to report her husband, flying his vintage World War II fighter plane, 'went missing.' After some questions, it was determined the vintage plane was actually a radio-controlled model and it went missing in the woods surrounding the mill pond. Legend has it, the plane is still out there – somewhere.



January 18: I responded to a domestic situation involving multiple family members on N. Concord Rd.



January 19: I assisted on a mental health pickup call on Erie Rd.
