February 5: Three suspects went into the Concord Dollar General Store and engaged in a rather uninspiring price-swapping scheme. They were all local subjects and quickly identified. No decision yet on if the store wishes to press charges.



February 8: I assisted the Spring Arbor Police with the arrest of a male subject on a domestic violence call on Henderson Rd.



February 14: I assisted multiple units down on Goose Lake Rd. reference a suicidal subject. He was ultimately taken to the hospital for medical assistance.



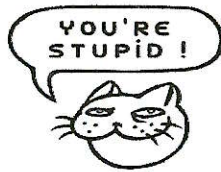
February 22: Units responded to the Concord PS Food Mart for a private property crash. A man in an old Jeep Cherokee smashed into a parked vehicle before driving off...



February 22: ... to the Sherman Apartments, where he and a female got into a heated argument. The female was arrested for domestic assault.



February 24: Units responded to Aldrich St. in the village reference a domestic situation. The male half of the incident was ultimately arrested for domestic assault.



In more cases of 'leave your cell phone in your pocket,' citizens called 911 to report the following:

- A woman called 911 to report that three juveniles (app. 10 years old) got off a school bus and, upon seeing her standing in the window of her home, pointed at her and laughed. She deemed that threatening.
- A 32 y/o woman called 911 because she wanted the police to force her mother to turn her cell phone back on. Apparently the mom paid for the daughter's cell phone and, when the daughter refused to pay her back, the mom shut it off.
