11/3: Deputies responded to an address on Behling Rd. in the Township for a natural death investigation.



11/5: I responded to a village church reference a subject charging devices and their vehicle from church power sources.



11/5: * And also on 11/6 - myself and other units responded to the Cadet for a couple of bar fights involving local residents.



11/8: I handled a domestic argument on Behling Rd.



11/9: Units responded to a resident on Maple St. in the Village for a domestic situation. A male subject had severe lacerations on his arm from smashing into a window. He ultimately transported himself to the hospital for medical treatment.



11/11: I handled a B/E report on Homer Rd.



11/12: While conducting a property/security check on a vacant house in the township, I discovered the back door had been kicked open. Nothing appeared to have been disturbed, although the old house was so utterly trashy inside it was hard to tell.



11/12: I was first on-scene for a suicide on Erie Rd. The lone occupant in the vehicle, while on the phone with his mother, took his own life via a single gunshot wound to his head.



11/15: I responded to a verbal domestic on Homer Rd. in which a male subject in Battle Creek threatened to bring a gun to the residence and cause issues. At this moment, he has not done so.



11/23: A verbal domestic on Albion Rd. featured a woman who threatened to 'stomp' her boyfriend's head in for chatting online to another woman. I advised the boyfriend to leave the residence, stop chatting online with other women and possibly get a helmet.

You'll get a faster response by calling 911 and informing them of the situation. If I'm on-duty, they'll send me anyway. (That is, until the cuts come through courtesy of our county commissioners and there's no one to respond anyway. But hey, good times.)
