CALLS OF NOTE



2/4/2025: I assisted the Spring Arbor Police Dept. on a weapons call. A subject was trespassing on someone else's property and hunting coyotes with an AR-15.



2/9/2025: Units responded to a crash on Hammond Rd. in Spring Arbor Twp only to discover the lone occupant/driver of the vehicle (a Concord Village resident) was highly intoxicated. He was transported to the hospital for his injuries and charged with drunk driving.



2/11/2025: A Village resident on S. Main St. had a package of pet medicine stolen off his porch after it had been delivered by FedEx.



2/18/2025: A Village resident was involved in a road-rage incident that began on M-60 @ S. Dearing Rd. in Spring Arbor. The anger and shenanigans continued all the way to Concord where the village resident shoved the other driver to the ground in anger. No charges have been filed at this time.



2/20/2025: I connected with 11 homes up and down S. Main St. about making sure their sidewalks are shoveled and I did this on a cold, snowy day. During this process, I lost feeling in my feet and saw visions of my childhood running through my head. I DID, however, get my steps in for the day.



2/21/2025: I responded to a car crash on Van Wert near Cornell Rd. A woman driving an SUV northbound lost control on drifted snow/ice. She veered off the road and into a tree, suffering a broken leg.



2/25/2025: Subjects cut some wiring from the Carr Bros. complex on Elm Row Rd. This investigation continues...



2/26/2025: I handled a B&E report of a residence on Luttenton Rd. in which a .22 caliber pistol and a .12 gauge shotgun were stolen.



2/26/2025: Traffic was stopped in both directions on S. Main St. @ Monroe St. for a large duck that wouldn't move for traffic. I was able to use my nurturing duck call to coax it out of the way and it waddled off... Upon further investigation, the duck's name is 'Carl,' and he's been struggling emotionally since the passing of his partner a few months ago. Please keep Carl in your prayers.
