CALLS OF NOTE



4/3/2026: I followed-up and worked on Village Ordinances, resulting in 3 citations sent out for various indiscretions, ranging from holes in roofs to junk/inoperable vehicles. Remember folks, I can't fix these things myself and I can't physically force anyone to do them, either. It's all a process.



4/3/2026: I responded to an address on Sears Rd. reference a civil dispute between family members after the recent passing of a loved one. Ultimately, this will be handled in Probate Court.



4/6/2026: Units responded to the elementary school to assist in dealing with a troubled student who routinely walks out of class and off school grounds. She was FINALLY corralled down in Pulaski near Swains Lake before being returned.



4/10/2026: Because it was reported locally and handled over the phone, I took a report from the Lightning Quick in Horton reference their air compressor unit being stolen and then recovered. Someone took it, made it about a half mile up the road and then dumped it in a ditch where it was recovered undamaged.



4/11/2026: The Michigan State Police handled – and are continuing to investigate – a very disturbing call in the township. A township resident called to report hearing shots fired in front of his house and locating multiple spent shell casings in the road. When the state police arrived, they were able to connect the

situation to a vehicle belonging to another township resident. All parties – all under 21 – denied any involvement, but none of them are cooperating with authorities. More to come on this...



4/13/2026: Units responded to the high school for a student who had run away from home and left troubling notes about her intentions. She was ultimately located in the Albion area and transported to the hospital for medical attention.



4/15/2026: The Spring Arbor Police Dept. assisted the local McDonald's with the termination of five employees and subsequent banning of them from restaurant property. I a



4/15/2026: A resident on Behling Rd. agreed to a price on a chip-sealing project, but upon completion of the job the company more than quadrupled the price. I advised the resident to pay the agreed upon amount and let the firm – should they wish – try to take him to court for any balance.



4/17/2026: A subject called the Concord Vet Clinic about getting his 'extremely aggressive' German shepherd in for a check-up. When they advised him they were scheduling 2 weeks out, he stated he would shoot the dog and it would be the vet's fault. He was advised there are emergency avenues available for such situations, but such threats to vet staff could only lead to trouble.



4/15/2026: While on patrol, I found a bunch of crap – old blankets, boxes, a vacuum cleaner, some cushions – dumped on Bath Mills Rd. near the river. I sifted through the refuse and located a couple of receipts, which I traced back to an address in Albion, where I then connected with the subjects involved. They went directly to that spot and removed every last scrap... Where it is now, God only knows...



4/25/2026: I assisted the Spring Arbor Police Department with a domestic situation involving a potentially suicidal subject on Bowerman Rd.



4/28/2026: A loose, aggressive dog was chasing vehicles and people on Hanover St. before Animal Control and some helpful citizens assisted in corralling the animal. The owner was issued multiple citations in this case.



It's common knowledge that society treats its' criminals better than it does its' senior citizens or veterans - so let's check up on them (the senior citizens and veterans, that is.) A village employee noticed she had not seen her elderly neighbor for a day or two and had me go check on him, which I was happy to do. Turns out, he WAS suffering from some medical issues and – if left unattended – might not have made it. After twenty-plus years of doing this job, a Personal Welfare Check is still something I do with understanding and compassion. (('My neighbor is speeding' calls? Not so much.))
